

A Day at My School

The day will begin with reporting, roll call and warm up exercises. This will help them establish a routine. They will be guided to follow the correct procedures at school starting from keeping their bags, taking care of their belongings, following class rules and getting to know each other.

The children will interact with each other during Circle Time.

Delegation of responsibilities to children would bring out their leadership qualities.

They will recite rhymes, sing Phonic Drill and songs, do Picture Reading with Flash Cards, listen to a story, do Show and Tell activity, play Thematic Games like looking for things that belong to a particular room and discuss their day.

Acquiring literacy is a major milestone for Nursery children. We will play literacy games like matching uppercase and lowercase letters, picture letter matching games, same phonic sound friends, riddles and picture description.

Audio visual software will be used to facilitate vocabulary building and developing expressive language.

We will explain the right procedure of doing writing work with emphasis on correct posture, appropriate grip and formations. All this will be done during 'seat work'. Kindly take care of these areas at home too.

We will use multiple ways of reinforcing and rewarding children to keep them motivated.

During lunch break, we will emphasize on table manners and will encourage them to feed themselves independently. We will appreciate if you send finger food in the tiffin and keep the serving size small.

It is important for children to learn to stay clean. We will explain to them the steps of washing hands and the importance of keeping them germs free.

We will invest the first few weeks in helping the children learn the right procedures of whatever they are doing. We will ensure that they learn to follow directions as it is an important milestone in the process of learning.

The children will do hands-on learning activities and have outdoor fun after the lunch break.

They will do experiments, demonstrations and investigations on sight, sound, taste, touch and smell.

They will have some time allocated for Free Play too.

We will end the day with cleaning up and discussion about the next day activities.




Delegating work is a wonderful way to divide one's workload and inculcate a sense of responsibility and organisational skills amongst children.
